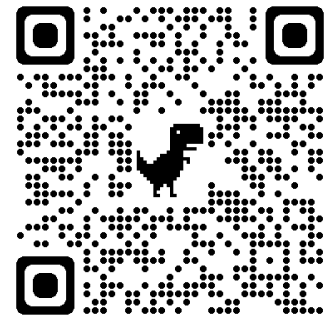

Paid on-the-job learning – 2023 starting salary of £20,475 (plus £4,918 London Uplift)

20% of time studying with external learning provider. 80% learning alongside BBC staff

Varied entrance level criteria – some schemes only require Maths & English GCSE or equivalent

Staff role offered on completion of apprenticeships with the exception of the Production schemes (training for a freelance career is given as well as access to internal BBC vacancies).

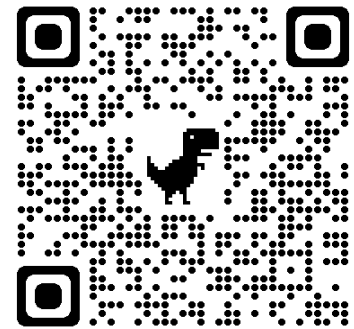

What are we trying to achieve?

- ▶ To recruit the best Deaf, Disabled and Neurodivergent talent into the BBC and allow successful integration into jobs with full accessibility.
- ▶ To normalise / embed Extend and disability recruitment into business as usual and allow for fully accessible recruitment practices.

- ▶ To provide ongoing training and support for managers and employees.
- ▶ To maximise staff retention and career development.
- ▶ To help divisions meet their disability workforce targets by 2026.
- ▶ To ensure accessibility across BBC systems, supporting users and managers.

- ▶ To provide complete pastoral support for disabled, deaf and neurodivergent staff.
- ▶ To be a recognised disability leading initiative, sharing best practice through regular marketing and comms.

BBC Sounds Audio Lab

Audio Lab is a podcast development programme at BBC Sounds – designed to amplify the next generation of podcasters and audio creators.

It opens once a year for applications from creatives who want to make the next podcasts everyone needs to hear!

Successful candidates get

- a full-time 8-month contract at BBC Assistant Producer level.
- Dedicated support via three BBC placements and one independent production company placement at various locations across the UK.
- Commissioning support and production funding
- A training and upskilling programme by the BBC Academy, featuring industry experts
- Artwork design and promotional plans
- Their podcast broadcasted on BBC Sounds
