

What is a Speculative Cover Letter?

A speculative cover letter is a way of approaching an employer when they are not currently advertising jobs. It is a great way of getting your foot in the door in competitive industries. If there is a particular employer that you would love to work for, or simply make connections with, writing a speculative cover letter can help.

What Should a Speculative Cover Letter Include?

- Include a name -You can find contact names on LinkedIn or by phoning an organisation
- First introductory paragraph highlighting who you are and why you are

- getting in touch- Here you should also demonstrate that you have researched the company
- A second paragraph highlighting your key skills and experiences
- A closing paragraph re-emphasising why you would be a good fit for the company

This speculative letter has been written in an email format. Email cover letters should be short and include neither the candidate nor the employers address.

Make a few different suggestions about things you could do as part of the internship. "complete a live brief", "work on a project" or "provide a helping hand with.."
