Student Agreement:

You will...

- be happy to take part in the Portfolio Day event delivered on campus (Arts University Bournemouth, Wallisdown, Poole, BH12 5HH)
- contact AUB staff if I will be absent for any reason
- follow instructions from staff and staff ambassadors
- follow emergency procedures such as fire drills
- respect the staff, student ambassadors and fellow students at all times
- let staff know if you see anything dangerous
- will let staff know if you feel unwell
- will wear suitable and appropriate clothing (and change if required)

You will not...

- smoke at any time
- bring, buy, sell or drink alcohol or illegal substances at any time
- fight, bully or use racial or other offensive abuse
- vandalise property or equipment

Students will be expected to behave in a responsible manner respecting teachers (tutors) and peers. Students not adhering to this will not be allowed to continue with the course.
