## Undergraduate (Degree) Students

(All BA (Hons) courses – first year entry)

Once you have successfully completed the 8 week General Intensive Course with good attendance, shown progression of your English level, completed all homework and passed the on-going assessments, you will progress onto the 5 week Pre-Sessional course at the Arts University College at Bournemouth. The 5 week course will be held on the University College campus.

### Pre-Sessional Course Outline Syllabus (an indicative guide)

Review and development of general English grammar, structure and vocabulary as language in arts based contexts.

Development of academic reading skills:

- Critical reading, analysis and evaluation of texts
- Skimming and scanning of academic texts
- Speed reading
- Vocabulary building and usage

Development of academic writing skills:

- Planning, structuring and writing assignments
- Note-making
- Summarising and paraphrasing
- Reflective writing

Development of academic listening skills:

- Following lectures, identify key points and take effective notes
- Taking part in discussions e.g. in seminars and tutorials

Development of academic speaking skills:

- Delivering effective presentations
- Taking part in discussions e.g. seminars and tutorials

Development of academic study skills:

- Conducting academic research
- Understanding and using academic writing conventions including referencing and in-text citation
- Time management and organisation skills
- Team working

## Accommodation

East and West House halls of residence are situated on the University College campus. There are 50 study bedrooms in each building, with shared kitchens located on each floor.

Each study bedroom (4.12m x 2.80m) is en suite and has:

- Shower
- Toilet
- Wash hand basin
- Bed (with storage under)
- Desk
- Wardrobe
- Drawers
- Shelving
- Chairs

Kitchens are located on each floor of the buildings, these are equipped with:

- Hob
- Oven
- Microwave
- Kettle
- Toaster
- Fridge
- Freezer
- Sink
- Lockable cupboards
- Preparation area

Each Halls of Residence has broadband connection, a payphone and lockable post boxes for each room. There is a laundry in each house.

Security officers are located on the University College campus at all times.

2012– 13 prices for rooms in East and West House are £98.00 per week.

Details of how to apply for a place in halls of residence will be available on the University College website from April 2012.

**Applications must be received by 25th May 2012**, and it is important that you return your application form by this date.

You will be advised in June whether you have gained a place in halls. Please note that you will be required to pay the deposit, equivalent to four weeks' rent, at that time.

More information about halls of residence is available in the Accommodation Pack, which you can download from the University College website from April 2012.

### Visa Requirements

After successfully completing the 8 week General Intensive Course you will be granted an unconditional offer and you will progress onto the 5 week Pre-Sessional course.

You will need to apply for a Tier 4 (General) Student visa with a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) which has been issued by the University College. You will apply in the UK, for a visa to cover the 5 week Pre-Sessional course plus your full-time degree course. You can start your course at the University College whilst you are waiting for your second visa to be approved. Approval is dependent on meeting all of UKBA's criteria.
