OUR COURSES

Costume

This is a creative and exciting course that provides a taster to the world of Costume in all its forms.

During this course students will be introduced to the Design, Supervision and Interpretation pathways of Costume and be given the opportunity to explore these areas through practical workshops.

Fine Art

What is an image? How do we see, remember and dream? In this workshop students will begin to answer these questions by thinking through a range of new and familiar materials. In order to do so, students will be asked to think of themselves as potential artists and will be instructed in the fundamental practical demands of drawing in relation to sculpture and vice versa, as well as other ways of forming, feeling and thinking about images.

Illustration

On this diverse and hands on course students will be able to develop their image making skills using a range of creative strategies and approaches including drawing, painting, collage and printmaking. Whilst exploring the question 'what is illustration?' students will be introduced broadly to this specialist subject. In sketchbooks students will use mind-mapping, research and idea development to plan and then produce a final outcome.

Interior Architecture

This inspiring opportunity will give students an insight into the diverse area of spatial design where they can explore the potential of three-dimensional spaces and discover that interior architecture and design is an exciting and growing profession in the UK and internationally. Introducing students to the skills and thinking needed to consider spaces and buildings, they will address issues such as spatial analysis, human need and behaviour, colour, materials and structure.

FREE SUMMER SCHOOL

Who can apply?

A key part of your role in recruitment to our Summer School is encouraging and supporting eligible students to apply. We rely on your knowledge of your students to identify the students who would make the most of this opportunity.

Applicants MUST:

- be in year 12
- have the potential to progress to HE
- satisfy one or more of the following criteria:
 - live in localities where participation HE is low
 - be from a disadvantaged background
 - have a special educational need and/or are disabled
 - be a looked-after young person
 - be in receipt of Free School Meals

What will students do at Summer School?

This five day specialist Summer School is designed to give your students a taster of studying their chosen subject at further or higher education level whilst also covering practical themes such as making a UCAS application, Student Finance, careers and student life. These sessions will allow prospective students to develop specialist learning, team building, problem-solving and communication skills. Please note, our staff will be responsible for welfare and safety of all students during the activity.

When is Summer School?

This activity will take place on 4th, 5th, 6th & 7th July 2016 from 09:15am-16:00pm, and 8th July 2016 11:15am-6:45pm. Students will need to commit for the whole five-day duration enabling sufficient time to complete their project.

Where is Summer School?

Summer School takes place on our campus located at Wallisdown on the border between Bournemouth and Poole. The campus offers a series of modern, purpose built studios, workrooms and teaching areas. The workshops and studios are well equipped to the latest in industry standards and the University offers an enviable provision of specialist computer equipment.

What happens after students have applied?

Once all applications have been received, we will let teachers know whether students have a place or not.

How do students apply?

We encourage the person with parental responsibility for your student (parents/guardians/carers) to read the student guide and then complete the online application form with the learner at aub.ac.uk/specialistsummerschool

What are the chances of getting a place on the Summer School?

Places are limited so please be aware that applying for Summer School does not guarantee anyone a place. Where possible, we try to allocate students to their first course choice. If we are unable to do so, we will try to place them with one of their other choices. Teachers will also be told if their students are on the reserve list and we will contact schools and colleges if a place becomes available.
