INTRODUCTION

Arts University Bournemouth (AUB) has between 3,500-4,000 full-time students, 350-400 staff, with around 220 car park spaces on the main campus.

The University wishes to encourage and promote sustainable and healthy transport options for students and staff, supporting the Transport and Travel Plan.

This document highlights the different methods of and incentives for travel.

VARIOUS METHODS OF TRANSPORT

Walking / Running / Cycling

There are shower and changing room facilities on campus for people wishing to use them. Showers are in K block (which also houses Student Services).

Hope 2 Cycle are a “charitable community partnership promoting health and wellbeing”. Located in Moordown, Bournemouth they provide “Dr Bike” health checks on bikes at campus and offer discounted second-hand bikes to AUB students. To find out more visit their [website](#).

For those without a bike, Bournemouth and Poole run a [Beryl Bike](#) share scheme offering bikes for hire throughout town.

The campus has approximately 290 cycle racks. The Police regularly provide free security markings to bicycles and the Students’ Union support ‘Bike Workshops’ when possible.

Rail

The nearest station to the University is Bournemouth, which is on the direct route between London and Weymouth. After leaving Bournemouth train station walk under the roundabout underpass and down Holdenhurst Road and catch the bus to campus (see below).

Buses

Yellow buses also operate across Bournemouth and Poole. The services they provide can be viewed [here](#). Students can travel at child fare for any single or return on Yellow Buses on showing a valid student card.

Motor vehicles

Arts University Bournemouth has approx. 250 car park spaces of which 14 are accessible bays.

There is high demand on the car park from staff, students, visitors, contractors and event(s). AUB also has to adhere to the responsibility placed upon it by the planning authorities for the appropriate management of parking on site. In consequence parking at AUB is limited and only available to those who meet the conditions for obtaining a permit.

PARKING TERMS AND CONDITIONS

A valid parking permit is required to park on site between the hours of 8.00 and 15.30, Monday to Friday, apart from 1 August to 31 August. Permits must be displayed on the windscreen at all times.

There is no student parking during the above hours with the exception of Blue Badge Holders. Students with a temporary disability are encouraged to apply to the Hardship Fund, which could support travel (such as taxi fares).

Students may be allowed temporary entry to the car park for a maximum of 30 minutes to deliver or collect personal work that is not practicable to be transported other than by car. This is at the discretion of the Security team, and will only be permitted if it will cause minimum disruption.

ENFORCEMENT & APPEALS

Unacceptable conduct or contravention of the car parking regulations may result in the withdrawal of parking privileges and/or University disciplinary procedures. Appeals against any parking enforcement measure must be made, in writing, to the Head of Estates and Campus Services within 14 days of the enforcement measure being issued. Appeals will be considered and a verdict made within 30 days of the appeal; there is no further appeal against the judgement of the Head of Estates and Campus Services.

DAMAGE AND LOSS

Parking in University car parks is done so at the vehicle owners own risk. The University accepts no responsibility for damage or loss sustained to vehicles or their contents.
