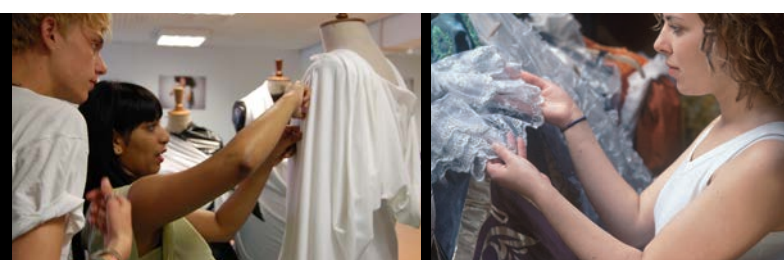


COSTUME

GAIN A UNIQUE INSIGHT INTO HOW THE PROCESS OF COSTUME FOR PERFORMANCE EVOLVES

3 WEEKS

8th – 26th July 2013



Explore the process of creating period female dress for performance through the creation of a 19th century corset and the cut and manipulation of fabric by draping and cutting a series of 19th century female toiles on a mannequin. Through a series of lectures, demonstrations and practical workshops you will learn how to cut bodices, sleeves and skirts as well as applied accessories and trimmings.

You will explore how the corset changed the shape of the female body and how styles of dress changed through the Victorian era.

This course will be supported by museum visits to view and study original period garments.
